



POTIONS AND LOTIONS

Location: Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary
Length: 1 hour long
Cost: \$6 per child, \$3 per adult; \$30 minimum
Ages: 2nd grade and older

PRIVATE TEA PARTY

Location: Gadsby's Tavern Museum
Length: 1.5 hours long
Cost: \$250 for 10 children. Additional children \$15 each. Adults \$10 each.

Explore life in the 18th-century through a tour of the museum, craft, games, and tea. Includes etiquette lesson and opportunity to practice. Led by costumed staff person. Additional time for awards ceremonies can be purchased.



Preparing for a Ball (D, B, J)

Gadsby's Tavern Museum

Balls were a girl's favorite thing to do in the 18th century. Explore the tavern where famous balls like George Washington's Birthnight Ball were held and practice the tasks involved in preparing for a ball. Includes an 18th century dance lesson and a craft to take home! 1 hour program with times available throughout the day. Cost: \$6 per person.

Wonders of Science (B, J, C)

Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum

Discover curious objects, from poison bottles to dragon's blood, and find out how they were used in medicine— and if they worked! During these hour-long tours, Project Enlightenment, McLean High School's historical-reenactment society, will conduct 18th century scientific demonstrations which are certain to expand visitors' knowledge about science in the 1700s. Cost: \$6 per person



Mad Science! (B, J)

Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum

What do super heroes, crazy animals, and explosions have in common? A mad scientist probably made them! Explore where real science and mad science collide in this 45 minute program that feature historic medicines with surprising side effects, hands-on experiments with the Museum's very own mad scientist bringing, and a gooey craft. Admission is \$6 per person. Program completes all but one part of the *Home Scientist* badge for Brownie Girl Scouts.



Her Story: Women in Action (D, B)

The Lyceum: Alexandria's History Museum

Celebrate women and learn about issues important to women and girls in your community! Girls will participate in hands-on activities and talk with a panel of Girl Scouts and discover how scouting empowered them. Girls and adults will learn about Juliette Gordon Low by looking at a timeline of her life, and add their own future goals to a timeline. Admission is \$6 per person.
