NOVA Parks Usage by Alexandria Citizens

The City of Alexandria joined NOVA Parks in 1969 with the acquisition and restoration of the Carlyle House. In 1981, the City leased NOVA Parks the land that is now Cameron Run Regional Park. NOVA Parks developed all the facilities on this site.

In addition to the two parks in Alexandria, City residents have access to all the other regional facilities in the NOVA Parks systems including 32 parks with over 12,000 acres of land. A 2014 survey conducted by the City showed the extensive use City residents make of the regional park system.

- 60% of City residents use Cameron Run on a regular basis
- 31% use the W&OD Trail regularly
- 25% regularly visit the Carlyle House
- 21% use Pohick Bay Regional Park with golf, camping and river access
- 19% use Bull Run Regional Park with trails, camping, light show and event facilities
